# **Stop the War End the Funding**

The war in Iraq is a disaster that has cost the lives of thousands of Iraqi civilians and caused untold horror as the country slips further every day into chaos. Three thousand four hundred U.S. soldiers have died, and over 34,000 have been wounded. Six of our own students at the City University of New York are among the war dead. The financial costs are staggering, too: the war is costing \$275 million *per day*, with the total now fast approaching a half *trillion* dollars. All of that is money desperately needed here in the U.S. — for education, veterans' benefits, healthcare, housing, and jobs.

The majority of Americans oppose the war, yet President Bush's response has been to escalate. *The only way to stop the war is to end the funding. The only way to stop Bush is for Congress to act and use its "power of the purse" to cut off the money that fuels the war.*

*Despite her vote on May 16 for a procedural motion to stop funding for combat troops in a year, and her co-sponsorship of a symbolic bill to reverse the 2002 authorization of force, Senator Clinton continues to support every bill to fund the war.*
